All 10spd chains are the same "standard" of chain - however minor differences of external width MAY impact some final compatibility. Ie sram 10spd chains tend to run a little wider than most others, campy thinner. As such some brands links may be a tight fit on sram chains etc. If listed as "not officially" compatible - this means that a brands link has not specifically stated compatibility with other brands chains, however within 10spd being same standard - incompatibilities issues are not generally expected, but are not impossible based on final mfg tolerances (ie worst case, a master link might be very tight and prevent free articulation)

*If you are immersive waxing, are staying with a single use link, and do not wish to risk re using an officially single use link - then move to hybrid approach of wax, re-lube next 5 times with immersive wax compatible lubricant (currently silca ss drip, Ceramic speed UFO all conditions, Tru-Tension Tungsten all weather), then re wax to reset any contamination starting to build and use a new link. For those re using links - other than wippermann connex - cap re uses at 5x maximum.

12speed chains see a variety of differing standards, so it can be more fraught to get the correct link for your system. Sram especially can be very confusing with 3 different "standards" of their own in 12spd which are mostly not cross compatible. For the columns showing "not officially" - these links are made for that brands chain which is of the same "STANDARD" - however are not specifically claiming compatibility with other brands chains. It is not expected there would be any issues - this can not be assured, but the odds of issues (ie tight link) should be very low. At the time of writing - NO MEANS NO. You would using a link made for a different chain standard, and risk of issues / failure is unacceptably high. One exception to this is campagnolo c-link - simply don't use for anything other than campy due to ridiculous cost.

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
